

## FIRST SUBMISSION OF DATA: 1ST-15TH APRIL 2013

All sites taking part in the information gathering pilot project are getting ready for the first submission of data at the start of April, for data collected on new cases between January and March. Data and Service Leads at those sites involved will need to ensure they have returned their signed ISA to MegaNexus, and been allocated a Service ID and login for the CORCNexus Dropbox. All other types of teams are collecting all required information.
